Theist	A person who believes in the existence of a God.
Agnostic	A person who believes that nothing is known or can be known of the existence or nature of God.
Atheist	A person who disbelieves or lacks belief in the existence of God.
Monotheism	A term for a belief system based on the belief in a single God.
Polytheism	A term for a belief system based on the belief in multiple Gods.
Beliefs	An acceptance that something exists or is true, especially one without proof.

Christians believe there is only one God, but that he is revealed in three different forms:

What do Christians believe?

- God the Father
- •God the Son
- •The Holy Spirit

Christians model the selves on the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. Jesus taught people to love God and love their neighbour.

Christians believe that God sent Jesus to live as a human being in order to save humanity from the consequences of its sins.

Reasons people do believe in God

- They have been brought up that way.
- They have experienced God seen him, had a prayer answered.
- They have seen a miracle.
- They can see evidence that God exists in the world.
- They just know God exists (faith).

Reasons people don't believe in God

- They can't see any evidence.
- There are scientific explanations for the world.
- There are too many bad things in the world
- would God make people suffer?
- Prayers aren't always answered.

Evolution

The process by which different kinds of living organism are believed to have developed from earlier forms during the history of the earth.



Religious people try to be 'good with God', but others think you can be 'good without God'. The British Humanist Association believe that:

- -Be honest
- -Use your mind
- -Tell the truth
