What is Early Support?

Early Support is a coordinated approach which brings together families and professionals to address a child/young person's additional needs or disability.

Early Support works to improve the way that services work with children/young people and their families.

Early Support uses a booklet called "All About Me". This booklet tells people from a child's perspective what is important to them and how best to support them e.g. their favourite toy or they don't like loud noises.



How Early Support works in Cornwall

Early Support works with children and young people aged 0 to 18 years with an additional need or disability.

The Team Around the Child meeting (TAC)

Where there are a number of services supporting a child/young person we provide coordination through a Team Around the Child (TAC) meeting.

The family chooses a Lead Professional who will chair the meetings and write a plan for the child/young person. The plan is regularly reviewed and meets the child and family's priorities.

TAC is voluntary and will only work with engagement from all TAC members.
