On Wednesday 18th October, Kernow Health will be coming into school to administer this years nasal flu vaccinations. The vaccination is being offered to all children from Reception to Y6.



Further to the letter your child brought home earlier in the week, please remember that the vaccine is offered on an '**opt in**' basis. This means that if you do not submit a consent form for your child, they will **NOT** be vaccinated.

It is used and loved by all of our children, from our youngest in BBeebies nursery, right up to our year sixes. It is also now the home of our new baby and toddler group, Tree Babies!

What was once an empty corner of the field, now has some well established trees (grown from baby saplings planted by our children), a fire circle, wood shed, mud kitchen, bug hotel, child-made bamboo teepees, large loose parts and planks of wood for obstacle courses, growing willow structures, a


digging area, planters for fruit and vegetables, and has seen many den-building sessions, fairy gardens, mud pies, minibeast hunts and so much more!
