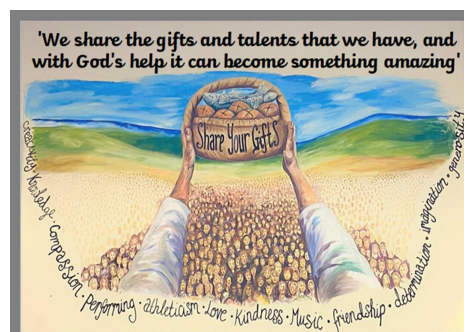
For creating a fantastic image to represent the concept of atman in Hinduism
