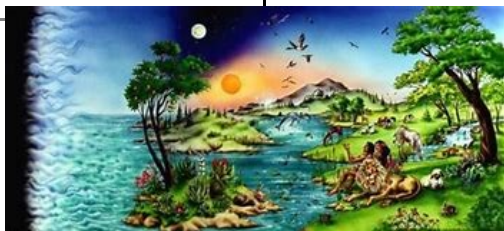


Some Christians believe that the Genesis 1 creation narrative is a message about God's nature, rather than an exact account of what hap-

Some Christian's believe that scientific theories can explain HOW the world began and Genesis 1 explains WHY.

### Key vocabulary

<b>Creation</b>	Christians believe the universe and human life are God's good creation. Humans are made in the image of God.
<b>Universe</b>	Everything we can sense, touch, measure or detect. It includes living things, planets, stars, galaxies, dust clouds, light, and even time.
<b>Big Bang Theory</b>	When the universe exploded (Big Bang), nearly 14 billion years ago, it created time, space and galaxies.
<b>Evolution</b>	The way something develops and changes over time.
<b>Adaption</b>	The way something changes for the better to suit something new.
<b>Awe</b>	A sense of wonder.
<b>Psalm</b>	A song or poem from the Bible for worshipping God.
<b>Stewardship</b>	Looking after something
