Nasal Flu Vaccinations

On Friday 4th November, Kernow Health will be coming into school to administer this year's nasal flu vaccinations. The vaccination is being offered to all children from Reception to Y6.



Further to the letter your child brought home today, please remember that the vaccine is offered on an 'opt in' basis. This means that if you do not submit a consent form for your child, they will <u>**not**</u> be vaccinated.

Consents need to be in by Wednesday 2nd November.

School admissions

The online application process for starting school, transfer to Junior School and transfer to secondary school for September 2023 has now started. Detailed information about the admissions process is available online or on request from the School Admissions Team.

The deadline for applying for:

- Secondary school is 31st October 2022
- Primary school is 15th January 2023 (for children born between 01.09.18 31.08.19)

National offer day for:

- Secondary school is 1st March 2023
- Primary school is 16th April

Please ensure you name **more than one preference**. It will not mean less chance of securing place at your preferred school. Please note that if you do not apply on time, your preferred school may already be full.
