You may be aware from media coverage that the NEU (a Teaching Union) have declared strike action, which will take place on 1st February, 2nd March, 15th March & 16th March 2023. The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over teachers' pay. Whilst it is always our last option, we are giving you as much notice as possible that learning could be disrupted on the above dates. We will of course consider several options, including opening for some classes or year groups wherever it is safe to do so. We may also be able to open to a limited number of vulnerable students and some children of key workers but until we know how many staff will be in, we cannot guarantee this. We recommend that you start to make alternative childcare arrangements for these dates.

I am sorry about the potential disruption to you and to your child's education. I understand that this situation may be frustrating, but we will be working closely with our staff union representatives to keep up to date with the situation. I will inform you of the final arrangements as soon as possible.
