If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court.

What is the Local Governing Body's Role?

The Local Governing Body of our school plays a key role in:

- setting targets for raising standards of educational achievement
- monitoring progress towards meeting these targets
- · supporting and challenging the performance of the headteacher

A Parent Governor is not a delegate and does not speak on behalf of the parent body. The role and responsibilities of parent governors are no different from those of the other governors.

The Local Governing Body meets termly, the meetings are held in the evenings usually from 3.30 and run for approximately 2 hours. The term of office is 4 years.

As well as attending meetings Governors are also asked to look at specific areas of the school's work in more detail and report back to the Local Governing Body.

To help support Governors, everyone has access to further training to help build on existing skills or to develop new ones.

Further information will be sent out in September along with application forms.

Depending on the number of applications there may be an election process, which will be advised in due course.
