Safe Guarding ALEPT	This leaflet tells you what the Council will do when they are worried about a child or young person.

Plan Plan	We can talk to you and your child or children to find out more and plan what help you need.
Consent 5 Yearener	<b>Consent</b> We will check that you agree for us to do an assessment.
Consent S Yourner	Only if we are worried about the safety of a child or children / young person do we not ask for consent.

	Who will do the assessment?

Consent	They will check with you that you agree for them to share information with other professionals.
Safe Guarding ALERT	If the worker believes your child or children / or young person may be at risk of harm they have a duty to pass on information.
X	This is to make sure no one is harmed.

Report	What happens after the assessment? You will be given a copy of the assessment report.
?	You are able to give us feedback on the report.
We and all Work of the second	<ul> <li>The support you may be given is:</li> <li>Told about support in your local community.</li> <li>Support from Early Help Services.</li> <li>Setting up a social care child or young person plan.</li> </ul>
	We will talk to you about what will happen.
Needs	We will ask you about your needs and wishes, and those of your child or children / or young person.

Data Protection Act	Where is the information on my child held? We will store your information securely.
	We treat everyone with dignity and respect.
	If you feel that you have not been treated fairly please speak with your worker or their manager.
	If you are not happy with the assessment
	If you are not happy with your assessment please talk to your worker.
