



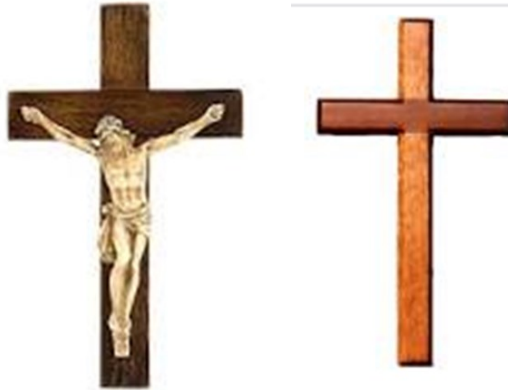

## Key vocabulary

Sacrifice	An offering, at lose to yourself or someone else
Crucifixion	An ancient form of execution where someone is bound or nailed to a cross
Salvation	Being saved or delivered from harm
Communion (or Eucharist)	A celebratory meal of bread and wine remembering Je- sus' death . Bread represents the body and wine repre- sents the blood.
Via Dolorosa	Where Jesus carried his cross to his crucifixion
Resurrection	The rising of Christ from his death

## By the end of the unit, you should be able to:
