Happy New Year! We hope you all had a wonderful Christmas break and stayed safe and well. It has been wonderful to see everyone return to school with smiles and smart uniform and it has been a super first week back here at school. We celebrated Epiphany during Collective Worship and have been thinking carefully about how we can share the gifts Jesus has given us by talking about and sharing our talents within our school community.

As you will have read, the COVID guidance about testing and self-isolation has been updated. Children with symptoms that test positive on a lateral flow test do not need to access a PCR (<https://www.gov.uk/government/news/confirmatory-pcr-tests-to-be-temporarily-suspended-for-positive-lateral-flow-test-results>). If they test positive, the isolation period begins. If they then lateral flow test on day 6 and 7 and both are negative, they can return to school. If not, the full 10 day isolation period still applies.

Children who are in a household with/or have had contact with a positive case are expected to lateral flow test (aged 5 and upwards) for 7 days. If this is negative each day, they can attend school. If for any reason a child cannot test, they should still attend as long as they have no symptoms.

I'd like to take this opportunity to remind all of our BB families that our wonderful PSA — Terri-Anne, continues to support and remains on call to help with any parenting issues. Let us know if you'd like her to make contact but please feel free to contact her on 07903 613074.

Esme

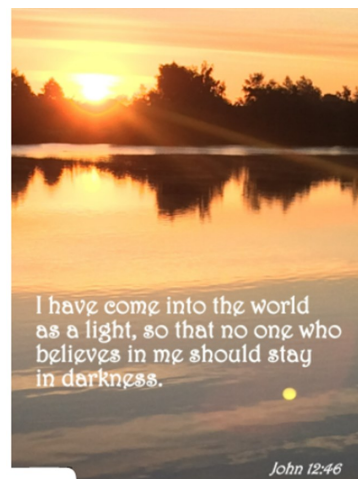
For sharing her gift of drawing during our RE lesson—she represented the creation story beautifully.

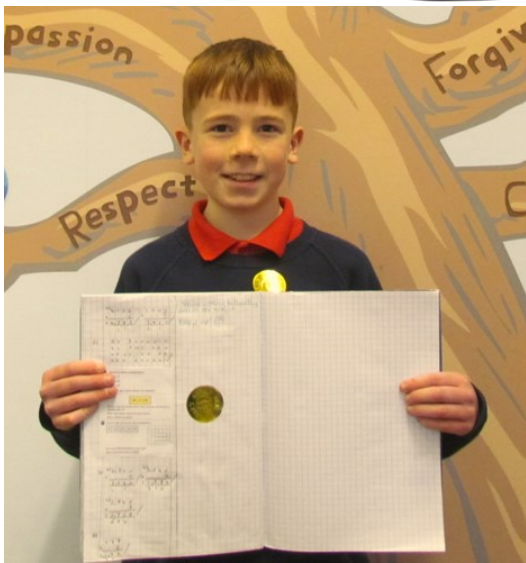
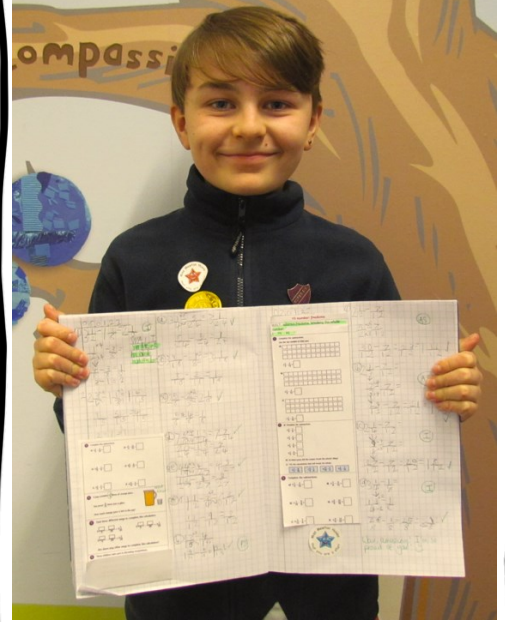
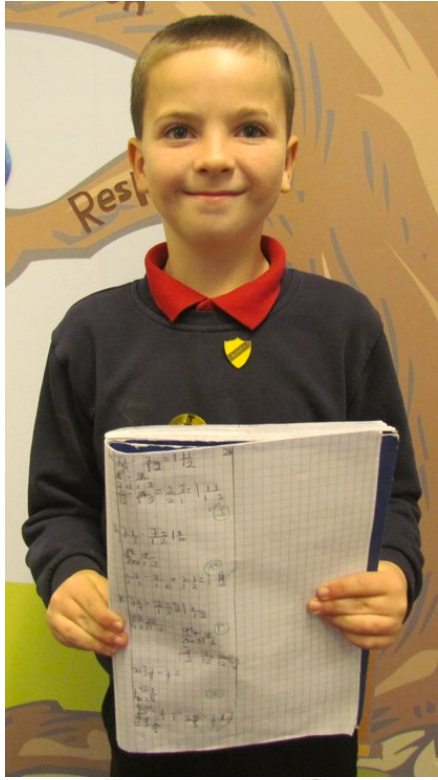
