Our School Blog...

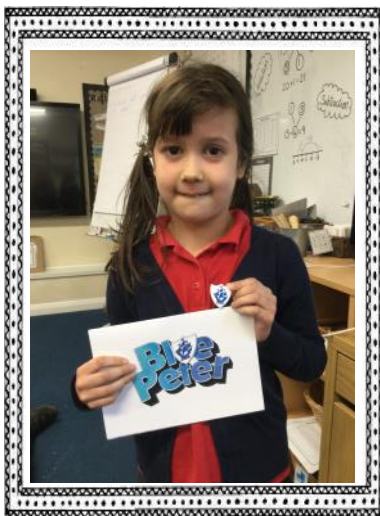

The message should detail your child's name, class and a brief description of their symptoms/illness or the reason they are not attending school. If your child is ill, you should contact the office every day throughout their absence.

Please refrain from emailing and or Dojo'ing class teachers.

It is important that you follow this procedure as it aids us in monitoring absences and identifying potential patterns of sickness e.g. Chicken pox, sickness etc.
