School admissions

The online application process for starting school, transfer to Junior School and transfer to secondary school for September 2024 has now started. Detailed information about the admissions process is available online or on request from the School Admissions Team.

The deadline for applying for:

- Secondary school is 31st October 2023
- Primary school is 15th January 2024

National offer day for:

- Secondary school is 1st March 2023
- Primary school is 16th April

Please ensure you name **more than one preference**. It will not mean less chance of securing place at your preferred school. Please note that if you do not apply on time, your preferred school may already be full.

You should also check your eligibility for Home to School Travel Assistance (if applicable) before naming your preferences (<u>http://www.comwall.gov.uk/schooltransport</u>)

Please be advised that there are planned changes that mean travel assistance currently in place for some school children will not be available to children starting school in September 2024. NOTE– parents/carers of children with an EHC Plan do not need to apply, you will be contacted by the Statutory SEN Service in the Autumn term.
